TOP 14 MUST SEE LOCATIONS IN ST. LOUIS



1. **Citygarden Sculpture Park:**

Enjoy all the Citygarden Sculpture Park has to offer! With a wide range of interesting sculptures, by a number of artists!

2. **Walk the MO Botanical Garden:**

Considered one of the World's top 3 Botanical gardens! Known for its beauty and scientific research, it also boasts a 14-acre Japanese garden

3. **See Forest Park:**

Home to 5 major cultural centers, Forest Park is one of the nation's greatest urban parks.

4. **Spend Time at The St Louis Zoo:**

The St. Louis zoo is consistently ranked among the top zoos in the world. It also happens to be one of the last free public zoos left in America!

5. **Visit The St Louis Art Museum:**

Pick Located in Forest Park the SLAM was designed for the 1940s World Fair, and is home to 36,000 pieces of art. Entry is always free.

6. **Have Fun at the City Museum:**

City Museum was founded by artist Bob Cassilly and his then-wife Gail Cassilly. The Cassillys and their longtime crew of artisans built the museum using all the

weird and wonderful things that cities leave behind.

7. **Visit Anheuser Busch Brewery:**

Known for its ability to embrace both tradition and innovation, Anheuser Busch is the US beer industry leader. It also was the first American brewery to use pasteurization to keep their beer fresh while shipping.

8. **Enjoy The Hill:**

Traditionally founded by Italian immigrants in the early 1800s, the Hill is still one of the strongest and most unique neighborhoods in the St. Louis area. This historic neighborhood is known for its Italian culture, food, and history.

9. **Stop by Ted Drews:**

Ted Drews is a classic in the St. Louis area, having been selling frozen custard for 80 years. It's a fan favorite for those coming from the Zoo or a Cardinals game!

10. **Visit the Delmar Loop:**

Lined with an eclectic mix of establishments, the Delmar Loop was named one of 10 Great Streets in America by the American Planning Association.

11. **Catch a Cardinals Game at Busch Stadium:**

Busch Stadium's iconic field and 16 distinct venues offer guests a

variety of elegant settings, gourmet dining and panoramic views that can't be found anywhere else in the city. Also home to the St. Louis Cardinals!

12. **Have dinner at Jazz St. Louis:**

St. Louis was an important place for early blues, jazz, country, and bluegrass. Jazz St. Louis is not just a venue, but a birth place to stoke your love of Jazz Music.

13. **Walk the St. Louis Walk of Fame:**

The St. Louis Walk of Fame is a free, open-air attraction that honors people who have contributed to US culture. All inductees were either born in the Greater St. Louis area or spent their formative or creative years there. The 170+ stars are located along 6 blocks of The Delmar Loop.

14. **Ride up the St. Louis Arch:**

Also known as the Gateway to the Midwest, the Memorial marks St. Louis' role in the westward expansion of the United States during the nineteenth century.
